## ParentVue

Parent Assist. Please sign up for this valuable tool in keeping up with your child success with ParentVue. There is also StudentVue for students to see their grades so they can keep themselves on task and up to date (building responsibility is a CCC Character Trait).

## Conferences

Face-to-face meetings are requested by families and by the school. In addition to an individual meeting with your child's teacher, conferences are a great way to **assemble a group** of people to discuss your child's successes or areas of concern. Contact your child's teacher, counselor, or administrator to request a conference.

## Letters/Post Cards



Letters and post cards are additional ways a teacher or school staff might communicate about a student's good behavior, academics, or citizenship. Letters **from Hines** will be sent home throughout the school year. Current addresses are requested; postage costs for undeliverable or returned mail add up!

## Go Guardian for Parents

Go Guardian for home is now available for parents. The parent app allows parents the same abilities that teachers have while students are at home. Parents are able to set parameters and get reports and see what their student is doing online at home.



Congrats! Our division has just granted you access to the GoGuardian Parent App



What is GoGuardian Parent? GoGuardian Parent allows parents/guardians to see what sites and documents their children are browsing and provides additional internet controls at home. The app gives a bird's eye view of the apps and websites that their kids are on most often and control during out-of-school hours. With this perspective, parents can be made aware of what types of browsing behavior of their children, so they can all work together with the school to encourage more effective internet browsing habits.

### What is included in this app:

- Top 5 summary of student browsing (apps, extensions, documents, and websites visited)
- Teacher interventions
- 30-day view of websites, videos, documents, apps, and extensions
- Ability to block websites on school-issued devices during out-of-school hours
- Ability to pause internet access on school-issued devices during out-of-school hours, either on-demand or at scheduled time

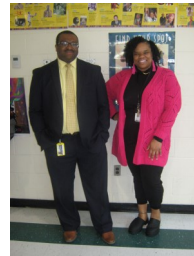

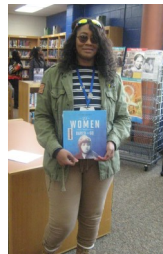

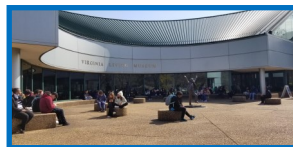
