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

something going on at your Hines Library!


Mrs. Farley likes to do contests to get students involved in the library. March's contest was estimating how

We encourage all Spartans to participate in an activity. Even though clubs have started meeting you may still sign up for Clubs and Activities!





Students from VTSS and PLS went on a field trip to Brooks Crossing Tech Lab and were able to design a name plate and see how other design tools









Career Day Fair
